First Reading: Genesis 15:1-6

The word of the Lord came to Abram in a vision, "Do not be afraid, Abram, I am your shield; your reward shall be very great." But Abram said, "O Lord God, what will you give me, for I continue childless, and the heir of my house is Eliezer of Damascus?" And Abram said, "You have given me no offspring, and so a slave born in my house is to be my heir." But the word of the Lord came to him, "This man shall not be your heir; no one but your very own issue shall be your heir." He brought him outside and said, "Look toward heaven and count the stars, if you are able to count them." Then he said to him, "So shall your descendants be." And he believed the Lord; and the Lord reckoned it to him as righteousness.

Gospel: Luke 12:32-40

Jesus said to his disciples, "Do not be afraid, little flock, for it is your Father's good pleasure to give you the kingdom. Sell your possessions, and give alms. Make purses for yourselves that do not wear out, an unfailing treasure in heaven, where no thief comes near and no moth destroys. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.

"Be dressed for action and have your lamps lit; be like those who are waiting for their master to return from the wedding banquet, so that they may open the door for him as soon as he comes and knocks. Blessed are those slaves whom the master finds alert when he comes; truly I tell you, he will fasten his belt and have them sit down to eat, and he will come and serve them. If he comes during

Mass setting: The New People's Mass, by Dom Gregory Murray

Organ Postlude: 6 Short Preludes and Postludes Op 105 – Allegro - C V Stanford

Published in 1907. This is a very engaging piece which showcases Stanford's lyricism and dramatic flair.

Sir Charles Villiers Stanford (30 September 1852 – 29 March 1924) was an <u>Anglo-Irish</u> composer, music teacher, and conductor of the late <u>Romantic era</u>. Born to a well-off and highly musical family in <u>Dublin</u>, Stanford was educated at the <u>University of Cambridge</u> before studying music in <u>Leipzig</u> and Berlin.

Stanford composed a substantial number of concert works, including seven symphonies, but his best-remembered pieces are his choral works for church performance, chiefly composed in the <u>Anglican tradition</u>. He was a dedicated composer of opera, but none of his nine completed operas has endured in the general repertory. Some critics regarded Stanford, together with <u>Hubert Parry</u> and <u>Alexander Mackenzie</u>, as responsible for a <u>renaissance</u> in music from the British Isles. However, despite his conspicuous success as a composer in the last two decades of the 19th century, his music was eclipsed in the 20th century by that of <u>Edward Elgar</u> as well as former pupils.
