The Baptism of Christ

Collect: Heavenly Father, at the Jordan you revealed Jesus as your Son: may we recognize him as our Lord and know ourselves to be your beloved children; through Jesus Christ our Saviour.

First Reading: **Isaiah 42:1-9**

Here is my servant, whom I uphold, my chosen, in whom my soul delights; I have put my spirit upon him; he will bring forth justice to the nations. He will not cry or lift up his voice, or make it heard in the street; a bruised reed he will not break, and a dimly burning wick he will not quench; he will faithfully bring forth justice. He will not grow faint or be crushed until he has established justice in the earth; and the coastlands wait for his teaching.

Thus says God, the Lord, who created the heavens and stretched them out, who spread out the earth and what comes from it, who gives breath to the people upon it and spirit to those who walk in it: I am the Lord, I have called you in righteousness, I have taken you by the hand and kept you; I have given you as a covenant to the people, a light to the nations, to open the eyes that are blind, to bring out the prisoners from the dungeon, from the prison those who sit in darkness. I am the Lord, that is my name; my glory I give to no other, nor my praise to idols. See, the former things have come to pass, and new things I now declare; before they spring forth, I tell you of them.

Gospel: **Matthew 3:13-17**

Then Jesus came from Galilee to John at the Jordan, to be baptized by him. John would have prevented him, saying, 'I need to be baptized by you, and do you come to me?' But Jesus answered him, 'Let it be so now; for it is proper for us in this way to fulfil all righteousness.' Then he consented. And when Jesus had been baptized, just as he came up from the water, suddenly the heavens were

opened to him and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and alighting on him. And a voice from heaven said, 'This is my Son, the Beloved,* with whom I am well pleased.'

Leading *Stations of the Cross* on a Saturday in Lent

The Stations of the Cross are a series of images stationed at intervals around the walls of the church telling the story of the last hours of Jesus' earthly life, from his condemnation before Pilate to the placing of Jesus' body in the borrowed tomb. Introduced into the church by S. Francis of Assisi, they gave those who would never be able to visit the Holy Land themselves the opportunity to enact in their own church a pilgrimage of hope, walking with Jesus to the cross and the grave, and beyond (summarised from Stephen Cottrell *On Priesthood*)

Over the last few years, different people from the gathered community here have led a *Stations* during the Saturdays in Lent, which starts at midday, and usually last around forty-five minutes. To give you a flavour, some have used our HTH *Stations* booklet or similar, and there have been interpretations based around knife crime, relationship and bereavement. If you would like to explore leading a week, please do have a chat with Caroline (Warden) by Sunday 18th January. Thank you.

Knitted bible figures

Can you take on a small spring knitting project? Inspired by the woolly Magi, we're asking any knitters to make some more figures using the same pattern. Do you have a knitting friend or family member who might be interested? These will be generic figures which can be used as disciples and followers, crowd (angry and happy!), wedding guests and so on. We will also need to make a couple of identifiable figures such as Mary and Adult Jesus.

Mtr Diane can talk about how these figures can be used in our work with children & families both at church and in the school.

An example of one of the figures, currently playing 'Joseph', is available at the back of the church - this took three evenings of knitting. You'll need 3mm needles and a small amount of double-knit yarn. I can provide the pattern and agree with you the character you'll make.

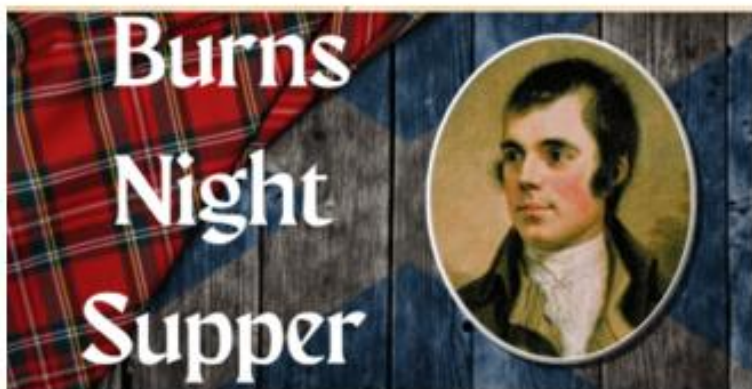
